

The Hockey Hall of Fame

Located in Toronto, the Hockey Hall of Fame is the premier destination for all things hockey. Dedicated entirely to the history of ice hockey in Canada, the Hockey Hall of Fame holds regular exhibits on famous players and teams and displays permanent galleries of National Hockey League (NHL) records, trophies, and miscellaneous memorabilia. DINING LANDMARKS

Lake Inez

Leave the touristy crowds behind and make your way over to Little India in the East End, where this beloved gastropub offers up eclectic share plates and a next-level selection of funky and fabulous wines and craft beers. There are no rules on this menu, which skews pan-Asian but truthfully includes influences from all over. To take your experience to the next level, make a reservation for the Mystery Patio, a covered space out back that offers an even more amped-up tasting menu experience.

Canoe Restaurant and Bar

Canoe has the best view in Toronto: the CN Tower standing on one side, planes landing at City Airport on another, and Toronto's glittering skyline sprawling beyond the horizon. And the food here is just as good as the real estate. The menu at Canoe is an adventurous, surprising, and just-plain-delicious celebration of flavors and ingredients from across Canada. Service feels just as top-notch—glasses are filled, tables are de-crumbed, and cutlery is replaced so fast you'll hardly even notice!

Quetzal

Tired of the same old, same old? Head to Quetzal—a sleek, contemporary space offering up sleek, contemporary Mexican. Quetzal is known for its excellent, highquality fare that offers an authentic, modern take on Mexican cuisine. Among its many notable menu items, enjoy house-made salsas, perfectly seasoned slowcooked lamb barbacoa, bone marrow and wild Argentinian shrimp, and much more.
