How to Establish a Named Fellowship

Establishing a named fellowship requires a minimum pledge of \$75,000 to be paid at a rate of \$15,000 for 5 years. This entitles you to name a fellowship, establish criteria on which students would be eligible to receive the Fellowship, and to offer recipients an internship at your company. You may also select a representative to serve on the Scholarship Council. You would join several other leading companies in making this vital commitment.

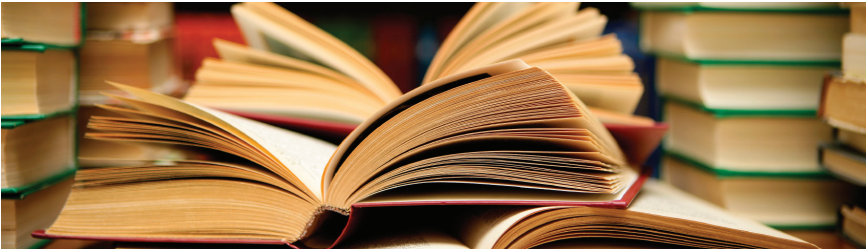

Fellowship Recipient Benefits

- \$7000 educational stipend sent directly to the student.
- Airfare, hotel, and registration for three ACI conventions: the convention where they interview and the two ACI conventions that occur during their award year.
- A \$250 stipend for each convention to be used for travel expenses.
- Convention guides for the convention when they interview.
- An industry mentor.
- Internships, if required or desired.
- Recognition during the Opening Session at each convention they attend.
- Recognition in *Concrete International*.
- Recognition on the ACI Scholarship Council website.

How to Establish a Named Scholarship
